## If you go down to the woods today... you don't generally see very much

But things are changing, and **Phil Morgan** will look at how advances in trail cameras are just one of the tools now available to us to see what's going on, and some of the recently recorded animals seen in the area. Whilst it's no picnic, he'll look into the not-too-distant future, and tools such as thermography, passive lures, remote sound recording, and satellite imagery, as well as AI, and how they are helping us understand what the bears are really up to.
